With the delivery of NOCMB capability, the NATO intelligence community will have a more dynamic and collaborative collection management process supported by an intuitive and user-friendly platform. Delivery of NOCMB MVP will also inform the requirements for a fully developed solution through the Common Funded Capability Development.


